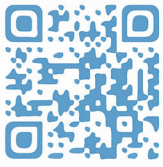


The Châtillonnais

Châtillonnais: enjoy it without moderation.

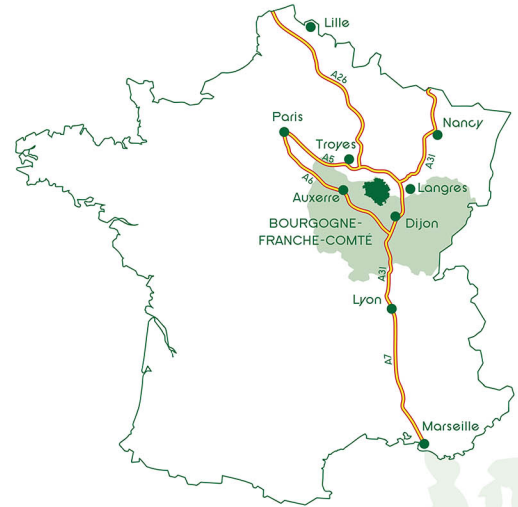
